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


Dear CATA Family,



<u>Seniors and Senior Parents, Class of 2022 Information about your Senior Portraits:</u> Seniors, it's time to get your senior portraits and yearbook photo taken! Go online to <u>cady.com/book22</u> to schedule your session! CADY has a studio at Crown Point Plaza in Matthews where your photos are taken. Every senior needs to get a picture taken with CADY so they will be in the yearbook.

- 1. CADY has a studio at Crown Point Plaza in Matthews.
- 2. When you go to the website, search for Central Academy, pick an additional scene, and then click continue.
- 3. On the next page you will see prices for session (sitting) fees. If you want the basic \$30 option then scroll to the bottom of the page and select simple session.
- 4. Your session fee (sitting fee) is the fee you are paying for the photographers to take your picture and there are a lot of different priced options with multiple locations, dedicated photographers, makeup artists, etc. This fee DOES NOT pay for any of the photos that you might want. You will have to purchase your photos after you receive your proofs.
- 5. Make sure to remove any pre-checked items you do not want such as double proofs, retouching, etc.
- Select your date and time, create an account, and pay the sitting fee.
- 7. Show up for your appointment date and time you selected to get your pictures taken.
- 8. After your pictures are taken you'll receive a portfolio in the mail. Keep anything you'd like to purchase and return everything else in the enclosed postage-paid envelope.
- 9. Remember, we want 100% of our seniors represented in this book but we can't do it without you.
- 10. Yearbook and senior tribute orders can be placed once school starts in the fall. The yearbook is always at its lowest price the first week of school so order early to get the best deal!

Items to Remember

Attendance and Absence Notes: Absence notes must be emailed and/or scanned to Mr. William Smith our data manager upon the student's return to school in order for the absence to be considered excused. Absences will be coded unexcused in PowerSchool until an email excuse is received. Please allow 24 hours for



excusal notes to be coded in PowerSchool. Students may fail if they have 8 or more unexcused absences per class. Attendance is taken each class period. Students will have a chance to recover up to three unexcused absences per class. Parents will receive notification upon the 3rd, 6th, and 8th unexcused absence.

Parking Passes— are now being sold on a first come first served basis. After we run out of spots, then students will be put on a waiting list. The process for purchasing parking passes will be on the online platform "FamilyID" An account has to be created if you do not already have one. Parking passes MAY NOT be purchased by any student who



owes outstanding fees. After completion of the application, CATA will review your submission. The student will then receive a spot number and a link to pay for the pass once the application has been approved via the email provided in the registration form. Passes are \$45. Early Dismissal: If a student driver needs to be dismissed early from school, a parent note must be emailed to Mr. William Smith, our data manager prior to the start of the school day in order



for the student to receive an early dismissal pass. The emailed parent note must contain the date, student's full name, the time that the student needs to be dismissed from school and the parent's phone number. Any student being picked up early from school by someone other than a parent, must follow the same protocol stated above while giving permission for someone else to pick up the student. Email the Mr. William Smith. In the event that a parent does not email a note, the parent must call the school to speak to someone in the front office.



Breakfast and Lunch: All breakfast and lunch meals are free to students this year! Students can purchase ala carte items if they would like. This includes premium chicken items, cookies, chips, sodas and water. To add money to their student's account they can visit k12paymentcenter.com

Dear Class of 2022.

We are very proud of every one of you. We hope you will have fond memories of CATA and of all the people here. Congratulations on making it to this point in your academic career. We would like to provide you some updated information for your senior year. We ask that you review the entire letter with your family to familiarize yourselves with the information and expectations.

Graduation: The ceremony is on Tuesday, June 7, 2022 at 8:00 AM at Walter Bickett Stadium. The address is 704 Washington Street, Monroe NC 28112. Please arrive no later than 7:00 AM to line up. Please be aware of traffic and plan accordingly to arrive on time. A map and directions will be provided for you on a later date. We will send more specific information about graduation day in the Spring Senior Class of 2022 Letter.

Graduation Practice: Practice is on Monday June 6, 2022 from 2:00-4:00 PM in the gym and or Walter Bickett Stadium/ Education Center (Students will be notified of the location in the Spring Senior Letter). Please arrive no later than 1:45 PM. Be aware that we must begin at 2:00. Please make sure to make plans to attend the entire practice. Failure to do so will result in not walking at graduation. It is your responsibility to schedule any college functions and work schedules around final exams, graduation practice, and graduation itself. You do not have to wear your cap and gown to practice. If you are speaking at graduation, then you should bring a copy of your speech so you can practice it a couple of times. You will not receive your tickets until the end of practice so make arrangements beforehand. Graduation Practice is required.

Attire: All students should be in their caps and gowns with comfortable shoes. Students may wear clothes for hot weather within the school dress code. Graduation Caps and Gowns may not be altered.

Senior Cap and Gown Picture: The above described dress code is what you are expected to wear at the senior cap and gown picture in April or May in the gym or outside. This occurs during second block and you must be present and in appropriate attire to be included in the picture (be here by 10:20 am if you flex first period). The exact date of the picture will be put in the Spring Senior Letter.

Senior Week is May 16 to 20: We will be sending more information about Senior Week in the coming months.

Senior Academic Signings: Each academy will continue with the tradition of seniors signing for their plans for college, military, or career. The Signings will be on May 16 and 17 and all grade levels will attend their Academy Signings. Signings will also include scholarship recognitions, Academy and Department Awards as warranted. Parents will be invited to attend. We will list a specific date and time for each academy in the Spring Senior letter.

Graduation Speeches: Each academy has one senior give a speech at graduation. A committee of the faculty and staff of Central Academy chooses the individuals for graduation speeches. Students may audition for consideration in May. Please pay attention for the audition date in the announcements.

Past due fees: Past due fees must be paid before students may participate in Prom or Graduation. Please make online past year technology payments through the Central Academy Website, and make all other payments at the school with the bookkeeper. Dr. Wall and other staff will be calling about past due fees in an attempt to settle all fees by the end of January.

Tickets: Tickets information will come out at a later date.

Everyone (including children) must have a ticket to enter the stadium.

Students will not receive their tickets until the end of Graduation practice.

Students owing fees will not receive tickets until fees are paid.

Please keep your receipt for the tickets in case there are any questions.

Graduating from high school is dependent upon earning the number and type of credits needed to earn a diploma. Participating in the graduation ceremony is a privilege, one that your family will truly value as they have spent a lot of time supporting you in your academic studies. Please take time to ensure that you are eligible to graduate by earning the credits needed. Please take time to ensure that you are able to participate in the graduation ceremony by making good choices for the remainder of your senior year and by making sure that you have taken care of all financial responsibilities. Specifically, students must pay all fees owed to the school in order to be permitted to participate in graduation ceremonies. This includes fees such as (but not limited to) cafeteria, media center, textbook, athletic, technology, property fees. Any unpaid fee owed to the school or school system must be paid by Wednesday, June 1 to be allowed to participate in a graduation ceremony. We are contacting parents and want to try to resolve fee issues as quickly as possible.
