

Dear CATA Family, By order of the North Carolina Governor public schools are closed until May 15.

UCPS Remote Learning Plan: Phase 4: Click here to find out about **Phase 3**, which we are in at this time. Phase three is through 4/19/20/. Beginning the week of April 20, UCPS will transition into **phase four** of the Remote Learning Plan. During this week, new learning of new standards will begin for all students. The work will be optional. However, students are encouraged to stay engaged and participate in learning opportunities. For high schools, new learning with new standards will begin Monday, April 20. While district leaders continue to seek guidance from the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction about grades, teachers will track participation, provide ongoing feedback and communication with students. Additional information about schedules and coursework will be communicated by the end of the week. Parents should contact teachers if they have questions about how to access assignments, the level of rigor of assignments or remote learning coursework/materials. Board of Education approves changes to graduation requirements for Class of 2020: During the April 7 Union County Board of Education meeting, board members approved changes to graduation requirements for the UCPS Senior Class of 2020. The changes, which were adopted because of COVID-19 and the associated March 16 – May 15 school closure, align with the amended graduation plan approved by the NC Board of Education on March 27. As part of the updated graduation requirements, UCPS high school seniors are now required to have a minimum of 22 credits by their originally scheduled graduation date. Prior to Tuesday's vote, current UCPS seniors would have been required to have a minimum of 28 credits to graduate with a high school diploma. Parents of high school seniors will receive more detailed information this week.

Devices and Wi-Fi access: UCPS is working to ensure that all high school grade students have access to a Chromebook. High schools will distribute devices on Thursday, April 9. Principals will contact parents about the distribution process and time. If your student is in need of Wi-Fi access, a nearby school can be a resource. Internet access is not only available inside school buildings. Wi-Fi connectivity can be accessed from school parking lots. As a reminder, school buildings are closed and staff will not be on campus to assist with any technology matters. To keep areas safe, deputies and officers will patrol campuses to enforce social distancing guidelines.

Spring Break: UCPS will follow the scheduled spring break calendar (April 9-17). April 9 is an Optional Teacher Workday and April 10 is a UCPS Holiday. Teachers and staff will not provide remote learning opportunities during this time.

<u>Meal schedules during spring break</u>: UCPS will continue this service during spring break, but meals will not be provided on Friday, April 10, which is a UCPS Holiday. Families will receive an additional meal on Thursday, April 9. The meal service will operate on its normal schedule during spring break, April 13-17, from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. at the four sites. Central Academy of Technology and Arts (CATA) would like to welcome our new head football Coach Shane Griffin. Coach Griffin comes to CATA after spending the past two seasons as the offensive line and run game coordinator for the Forest Hills Yellow Jackets. Coach Griffin will be entering his 20th year in the field of education and coaching as he takes over the CATA football program again in 2020. Coach Griffin will teach Physical Education and Weight Lifting at CATA this coming fall. Coach Griffin holds a BS in Parks & Recreation Administration & minor in Coaching from Wingate University. He also holds an MA in Education & Special Education from the University of Phoenix as well as an MA in School Administration from Gardner Webb University.

In 2017, he served as the offensive coordinator for Central High School (Pageland, SC). This will be Coach Griffin's third stint with the CATA football program as he was the head coach during the 2015 & 2016 seasons. In 2015, Griffin lead the CATA football program to the first ever 4-0 start in school history. He also served as the offensive line coach in 2012. Coach Griffin spent two seasons 2013 & 2014 at Anson High School as the offensive line coach and offensive coordinator. Coach Griffin has worked in a variety of capacities throughout his career from offensive coordinator to defensive coordinator as well as position coach for offensive and defensive line, running backs, linebackers and quarterbacks. The last 19 years of experience has taken Coach Griffin from North Carolina to New Jersey, and back to North Carolina and South Carolina respectively as a football, track and field, golf and softball coach at the high school level.

Coach Griffin played college football at Wingate University ('99) where he was a three time All South Atlantic Conference (SAC) performer at offensive tackle and also a finalist for the Jacobs Blocking Trophy awarded yearly to the best offensive lineman in the SAC. Coach Griffin is a native of Union County and spent his high school playing days at Forest Hills High School ('94) playing for Coach John Lowery. While at Forest Hills, Coach Griffin was a three year varsity athlete and allconference offensive lineman his junior and senior year. While playing at Forest Hills the Yellow Jackets had a combined record of 36-0 against conference opponents. Coach Griffin was also named to the All-State football team ('93) and was selected to the McDonalds East/West All-Star game ('94). Coach Griffin is 43 years old and has been married to his wife Jennifer, for 16 years. Together they have three children: Jacob (14), Jordyn (12) and Jett Mike (6). Coach Griffin is excited to be back at CATA and is ready to get back to work. His passion is for helping kids reach individual goals while understanding the dynamics of being a part of a team working together to achieve the very best.

Union County Public Schools Remote Learning Guidance

As we work together to educate our children in this time of challenge, Union County Public Schools has established some guidelines to support parents and students during the transition to a remote learning environment. While there is no substitute for a nurturing, relationship-driven classroom, we believe that with your assistance, we can continue to provide students with meaningful learning opportunities.

Students in grades 6-12 have been learning in a blended (face-to-face combined with online learning) classroom in Union County Public Schools for the last decade. Students will continue to work, complete activities, and access instruction in Canvas, just as they have done in their face-to-face courses. By working together to support our students, we know we will be able to overcome the challenges we are currently facing. You should receive additional school/class specific information from your child's school and/or teacher at some point next week. In the interim, here is some general guidance that may assist all parents as we transition to this platform for learning.

- Teachers will maintain "remote" office hours for a minimum of 2 hours on designated office hours days and should respond to student/parent inquiries within 24 hours to the greatest extent possible.
- Teachers will maintain "remote" contact with all students to monitor student participation and progress.

Based on feedback from stakeholders, the proposed schedules below have been designed as an optional model for consideration in order to allow the greatest flexibility for teachers, students, and parents. No times have been assigned to any course so that students may work at their own pace and teachers may support as needed.

Teachers should update their Canvas pages by 8 a.m. each day (M-Th) so that students have access to the most recent supplemental/review materials available. Additionally, professional development/support opportunities will occur in an asynchronous format (i.e. not real-time) so that staff may adjust their daily schedules to meet their individual needs.

Recommendations

- On Mondays and Wednesdays, students may elect to focus on their first and second block courses
- On Tuesdays and Thursdays, students may elect to focus on their third and fourth block courses
- Flexibility is key-instruction and activities will be at the student's pace/learning style; students should not be expected to be online with teachers at a specific time
- Office hours are driven by the teacher/student as needed students and teachers may be online together
- Each subject should have no more than 90 minutes worth of supplemental materials/activities made available each week

Frequently Asked Questions for UCPS Remote Learning Guidelines

1. What are the daily learning expectations for students during the school closure?

Please refer to the remote learning guidelines that were distributed on Thursday, March 28. Click <u>here</u> for the most recent guidance. We will continue to use our normal means of communication as updates/ changes are made to our guidelines.

2. How is remote learning defined in UCPS and in the State of North Carolina during the school closure?

In North Carolina and Union County Public Schools, remote learning is defined as learning that takes place outside of the traditional school setting using various media and formats, such as but not limited to: video conference, telephone conference, print material, online material, or learning management systems.

3. What is the expectation for grades and required assignments during the school closure?

All schools in UCPS are prepared to provide remote learning opportunities to engage all students, continue academic growth, and respond to social and emotional needs. It is paramount to remember the unprecedented condition students are learning in and to focus on engagement more than evaluation or grading. As such, UCPS is not requiring any assignments or grading at this time.

4. How is the NC Department of Public Instruction addressing matters related to seniors who are expected to graduate?

On Friday, March 27, the North Carolina State Board of Education issued guidance on how school districts should proceed with regards to spring grading practices for NC K-12 public schools. Seniors will not be penalized as a result of the school closure order issued by the governor and will pass a course if they were passing the class on March 13.

If seniors had a grade of 'F' in a course as of March 13, they will get a withdrawal code for the class, meaning they won't receive credit. However, UCPS will put practices into place to give these seniors a chance to pass the course.

More information will be shared with schools as district staff have an opportunity to review the State Board of Education's recently issued guidance.

5. If my student was enrolled in Advanced Placement courses, how can he/she continue with online learning during the school closure?

AP updates for schools impacted by COVID-19 can be found by clicking <u>here</u>. The College Board is providing online instruction for <u>AP courses</u> and is working on an at-home testing option.

For each AP course, there will be a "secure 45-minute online free-response" exam. The exams will focus on the content most schools completed by early March. Students can take the exams on a smartphone, tablet, or computer, and will also be able to write the responses and submit a photo.

6. How will UCPS address remote learning for elementary students?

If you are unable to make successful contact with your child's teacher, please contact your school's principal. Email contact information for all school-based employees can be found on each school's website.

8. What conferencing platforms are approved for students and teachers to use during the school closure?

As teachers increase their communication with students remotely, it is essential that Board of Education Policies are followed in this new setting.




