All students and parents please stay tuned for more information in the coming weeks for details about graduation, returning items that belong to the school. (Uniforms, textbooks, calculators, library books, Chromebooks, and chargers). Please review the grading information for all grade levels. UCPS Remote Learning Survey: UCPS employees, parents and students are strongly encouraged to participate in a survey about remote learning. Your feedback will assist staff in developing a remote learning plan to best serve our students. The survey is also posted in the Announcements Section on the UCPS homepage and on each school's webpage. The survey will close May 29.

<u>UCPS Remote Learning Plan: INFORMATION for all Grades:</u> During Phase 4 students will proceed with checking in with their 1st and 2nd block classes on Mon. & Weds. and 3rd and 4th block classes on Tues. & Thurs. Fridays are Teacher Office Hours. Students are encouraged to participate in the **NEW LEARNING** 180 mins. per week/per class or 90 mins. per class/per day. Teachers are providing ongoing feedback and giving students grades at this time who are participating in remote learning. Grading Policy for Grades 9 to 12: All Students will have two options for each final course grade:

- 1. Numeric grade, the highest grade representing learning as of the end of the fourth term (T4) or the Average of fourth and fifth terms (T\$ & T5) (The one that is higher). OR 2. PC19 or WC19
- -Students will determine how each final course grade will appear on the transcript at the end of the semester after advising from the teacher/school and in consultation with the parent/guardian.
- -When students choose to report a numeric grade as the final grade on the transcript, the numeric grade will be calculated into the cumulative GPA, following the guidelines in SBE policy GRAD-009.
- -When students choose to report a PC19 or WC19 as the final grade on the transcript, there is no GPA impact when using these grades.
- -When students in a yearlong course choose a PC19 or WC19 for the spring portion of the course, the fall term grade will be counted into the GPA.
- -Students will not receive a failing grade. LEAs/Charters will advise the use of WC19 for any student who is failing as of March 13 and was unable to improve through remote learning opportunities.
- -A final grade of PC19 does award a full unit of credit for a high school course while a grade of WC19 does not award a unit of credit.
- -WC19 does not equate to a failing course grade but indicates a lack of evidence of mastery of standards addressed in the particular course and that the school is unable to award a unit of credit.
- --Students will maintain the grades for fall courses as already stored, year-long and semester. Fall 2019 final grades will be calculated into a student's GPA.

-Teachers will be giving grades for the fifth term until the end of the school year for those who are participating in remote learning at this time and there will be no sixth term. This means students can take the fourth term grade, take the fourth term plus fifth term average if it is higher than the fourth term grade, choose PC19 for credit if passing as of March 13, or chose WC19 if failing as of March 13 and did not participate in remote learning. Testing Updates:

- Board of Education approves changes to graduation requirements for Class of 2020: During the April 7 Union County Board of Education meeting, board members approved changes to graduation requirements for the UCPS Senior Class of 2020. The changes, which were adopted because of COVID-19 and the associated school closure, align with the amended graduation plan approved by the NC Board of Education. As part of the updated graduation requirements, UCPS high school seniors are now required to have a minimum of 22 credits by their originally scheduled graduation date. Prior to the change, current UCPS seniors would have been required to have a minimum of 28 credits to graduate with a high school diploma. Parents of high school seniors will receive more detailed information.

ATTENTION JUNIORS - Common App Essay Prompts have been released. This is something you can work on now and it will make your senior year much easier. The prompts are listed below -

- 1. Some students have a background, identity, interest, or talent so meaningful they believe their application would be incomplete without it. If this sounds like you, please share your story.
- 2. The lessons we take from obstacles we encounter can be fundamental to later success. Recount a time when you faced a challenge, setback, or failure. How did it affect you, and what did you learn from the experience?
- 3. Reflect on a time when you questioned or challenged a belief or idea. What prompted your thinking? What was the outcome?
- 4. Describe a problem you've solved or a problem you'd like to solve. It can be an intellectual challenge, a research query, an ethical dilemma anything of personal importance, no matter the scale. Explain its significance to you and what steps you took or could be taken to identify a solution.
- 5. Discuss an accomplishment, event, or realization that sparked a period of personal growth and a new understanding of yourself or others.
- 6. Describe a topic, idea, or concept you find so engaging it makes you lose all track of time. Why does it captivate you? What or who do you turn to when you want to learn more?
- 7. Share an essay on any topic of your choice. It can be one you've already written, one that responds to a different prompt, or one of your own design.

Grades 9-12 Communication Highlights

- Schedule will begin on April 20 and assignments will be posted in Canvas by 8:00 a.m. each day.
- Students will spend no more than 90 minutes on activities per subject/course each day.
- Students receive instruction, assignments, and/or activities in each course for which they are enrolled.
- Students/parents should direct questions to teachers of the subject/course.
- Teachers will maintain "remote" office hours for a minimum of 2 hours on designated office hours days and should respond to student/parent inquiries within 24 hours to the greatest extent possible.
- Flexibility is key instruction and activities should take into account each student's current situation
- New standards of instruction will be introduced and students are encouraged to stay engaged and participate in the learning opportunities.
- In order to support all students, teachers will track student participation and monitor student progress
 through feedback. This will be done in order to make sure our teachers know which students may need
 additional support once UCPS has completed remote learning due to COVID-19 school closure and students
 and staff return to school next year.
- Grading guidelines for students in grades 9-12 have been developed and approved by the North Carolina State Board of Education.
