Graduation is on Thursday, June 11, 2020 at 1:00 PM at the Winthrop Coliseum in Rock Hill, SC

PSAT: ALL **sophomores** will be taking the **PSAT** and the juniors who earned 90% on the one they took when they were 10th graders. The date of the PSAT is 10/16.

ACT—All juniors will be taking the **ACT** on 2/25, a college entrance exam. In order to best prepare all juniors will work on ACT preparation during Cougar Time two times per week.

Scholarship Spotlight-Click HERE for more scholarships

John Crowder Service Award - This award is designed to honor a student for outstanding community service. Student must be academically sound and have no discipline referrals for the school year. Student must have an established history of community service in more than one area or with more than one organization. Application: Students interested in being nominated for this award must complete the Scholarship Nomination Interest Form (found at the top of this page) Amount: No amount awarded, Deadline to submit form: September 9, 2019.

Morehead-Cain Scholarship at UNC Chapel Hill- The Morehead-Cain is a four-year, fully funded educational experience for students of the highest caliber. It not only provides a full ride, but it offers life-changing summer enrichment and Discovery Fund experiences. The Morehead-Cain Foundation seeks motivated, courageous, and inquisitive leaders interested in embracing new and unknown experiences. Applicants must exhibit four criteria: leadership, moral force of character, scholarship, and physical vigor. To be eligible, a student must be a competitive applicant to UNC Chapel Hill and on track to graduate in the spring of 2020. Students can apply Early Decision to another institution and still apply for the Morehead-Cain. Students will be notified of their semifinalist status before the Early Decision deadline for other institutions. Application: Students interested in being nominated for this award must fill out the Scholarship Nomination Interest Form (found at the top of this page). Students will be notified of their nomination by Sept. 27, 2019. Nominees will then be given further directions on how to apply for the scholarship. Amount: Full ride, Deadline to submit nomination form: September 13, 2019.

Park Scholarship at NC StateThe Park Scholarship looks for exceptional students who are accomplished and have potential in the areas of character, leadership, scholarship, and service. Students must be applying to NC State. Students do not have to be a resident of the United States to apply.

Application: Students interested in being nominated for this award must fill out the Scholarship Nomination Interest Form (found at the top of this page). Amount: Four-year award valued at up to \$111,000 for in-state students

Deadline to submit nomination form: September 20, 2019

DAR Good Citizens Awards and Scholarship Contest

The DAR Good Citizens program is intended to encourage and reward the qualities of good citizenship. The student selected as the DAR Good Citizen must have the qualities of dependability, service, leadership, and patriotism (unselfish interest in family, school, community, and nation) to an outstanding degree. The student chosen as CATA's Good Citizen will be given information on the scholarship contest. <u>Application:</u> Students interested should complete the Scholarship Nomination Interest Form (found at the top of this page). <u>Amount:</u> \$250 - \$5,000. <u>Deadline to submit nomination form:</u> September 23, 2019.

Parking Passes

- ALL past due student fees must be paid before you are permitted to purchase a parking pass—this includes the 2016-2017 AND 2017-2018 technology fees, media center fees, cafeteria, and any fees owed to CATA.
- ALL Students, MUST print and bring ALL required documents with you along with the cash (exact amount) or check for \$40 made payable to Central Academy of Technology & Arts. Any incomplete application packets will delay the process and you canNOT reserve your parking spot until all documents and check are turned in. Please make sure to have your parent sign the registration forms. They are available on the CATA website under "Students". Click here for the link.
- <u>Students may choose their parking spot number if they purchase BEFORE the first day of school.</u>
 After that we will sell remaining spots in order.
- If you pay with cash, you MUST have exact change.

Parking passes are not guaranteed available throughout the school year. Once we sell out we will start a waiting list. Students obtaining their license during the school year are not guaranteed a spot, and may have to wait until the following year to drive. We will have a waitlist for those students bringing in all appropriate documentation.
