The application period will open Friday, Oct. 30 and close Sunday, Nov. 8 at 11:59 p.m. I. f your child will remain in or transition to Plan B for inperson learning at school, two days a week, there is no action for your family. Under Plan B, students are expected to attend school (in person) on their assigned day. Students who do not attend school will be



Virtual Athlete/Parent Preseason Meeting: Due to limitations on gatherings, we will not be holding any in person preseason meetings. All students interested in participating should follow the link below to our virtual meeting and complete the sign off. This must be done before starting a sport. **UCPS Eligibility – Attendance Matters:** Union County Public Schools will enforce a previously used attendance rule as it relates to athletic eligibility. In order to be eligible for interscholastic athletics participation, students must have been in:

- Daily attendance 85% (No more than 13 absences a semester) of the previous semester and must meet all applicable eligibility standards of the NCHSAA.
- PowerSchool defines daily attendance as being present 2 blocks. Absences recovered through attendance recovery will not change the attendance record and therefore will impact opportunities including the ability to participate in interscholastic athletics.
- Schools will have the opportunity to submit a hardship request based on a legitimate circumstance, such as a medical condition, which may have created an attendance hardship.

SPCC Update/Calendar Reminders: November 16<sup>th</sup> – SPCC Registration for Spring courses begins

> All students will register during this period – new and returning students. Make sure you are following SPCC procedures and guidelines for registering for courses. This registration period is only for spring courses; students will register for summer courses at a later date. Attendance will be taken for student participation on their assigned day at school and virtually each day in Power School. School is in session and students are expected



to be in class or logged into a class session at the appropriate time each day unless otherwise stated.

**Parking Passes** One cannot drive and park at the school if they have not purchased a parking pass. Parking in any lot other than the student parking lot is not permitted. The process for purchasing parking pass is on FamilyID this



year, an account will need to be created if you do not already have one. <u>Click here for</u> <u>FamilyID</u>. Parking passes MAY NOT be purchased by any student who has outstanding fees. After completion of the application, CATA will review your submission. The student will then receive a link to pay for the pass once the application has been approved via student UCPS email. Parking passes are \$45. If you have any questions, please email Mrs. <u>Andrea Nahum</u>. Bus Info: Parents should email <u>Ms. Tweed</u> if they need bus transportation. Bus riders and parents



should sign up for the Here Comes the Bus App. This app allows you to view the real-time location of your child's school bus on your smartphone, tablet or computer. ### Attendance and Absence Notes:

Absence notes must be **emailed** and/or scanned to





data manager upon the student's return to school in order for the absence to be considered excused. Absences will be coded unexcused in PowerSchool until an email excuse is received. Please allow 24 hours for excusal notes to be coded in PowerSchool. Students may fail if they have 8 or more unexcused absences per class. Attendance is taken each class period. Students will have a chance to recover some unexcused absences.

### **Exam Information**

All students who take STATE EOC or CTE Exams must take their exam in the school building. If a student does not complete their final State exam (EOC or CTE) or teacher made exam within the five-day window they will receive a final grade of 0 and it will be averaged into their final grade. Mask, social distance, and room capacity rules will apply. Student drivers must park in their assigned student parking lot spot. If you have not purchased a parking spot then you need to have a parent bring you to and pick you up from school. Please do not drive to school without a parking pass.

All students who have **Teacher Made Exams** will take their exams virtually. If your student has a problem with an exam, then they need to do the following

- Email the teacher
- Call the school immediately and ask for one of the assistant principals Dr. Wall or Mr. Stewart
- Teacher made exams will be posted on Canvas or on a link to Canvas. The teacher will communicate to students and parents exam links and expectations.

**Exam Exemptions for Teacher Made Exams ONLY:** Students will be notified by their teacher on Monday, 12/14. High School students will not be required to take a teacher-made final exam in a course in the following situations:

The student has an average of 90 or above the week prior to the administration of the exam and has no more than 2 unexcused absences in the class; or

The student has an average of 80 or above the week prior to the administration of the exam and has no more than 1 unexcused absence in the class.

Attendance: Attendance in the building during exam days is required for all students who are taking EOC and CTE Exams. Students who are taking teacher made exams should take their exam from home. Our normal school hours apply, but the schedule and lunch times are adjusted. December 21 is an important day for any students who have missed an exam earlier in the week due to illness. If missing the exam is due to Covid-19, the school will communicate a plan with each individual student and family. We regret that family vacation plans are not excused, and students cannot take exams early. We apologize that any requests for exceptions cannot be honored.

**Dismissal:** All students who drive to school and those who have parents drive them to school should plan to leave school around 1:05. Those students may eat lunch then go home or go directly home. **The only students who should remain on campus are bus riders.** Bus riders will go to their appropriate review session classes after lunch. All other students (car drivers and car riders should log into review sessions virtually). Students who ride buses who plan to leave early instead of waiting on the bus need to have a note they give to their teacher and the teacher will give the student a specific color pass to leave each day.

### <u>Exam Study Tips:</u>

Be on time! Students should be in their testing locations before 8:50 a.m. They will not be admitted to exams once testing has begun. Students are encouraged to sleep well each night (8 hours), and have a healthy breakfast each morning.

- · Create a study calendar and stick to it
- · Ask your teacher for a study guide and USE IT!!
- · Use your notebook to guide you through a review of the course
- · Attend all review sessions offered
- · Go to tutoring for extra support
- · Make a virtual study group, assign each person a topic to re-teach, and discuss each topic
- Have your parents ask you questions
- We know studying with classmates virtually can be different but still effective.
- · Use diagrams, graphs, pictures, and drawings in your textbook to serve as a
- talking point for you to review
- · Make flashcards on your computer or phone to practice important vocabulary words
- · Look at your scores from the semester and identify topics you struggled in ask
- · your teacher or a friend for help
- · Stay after school to study let an administrator know which days your study
- · group needs to stay and study and we will arrange for you to stay to study
- · Rewrite important points, the act of writing or typing helps some people remember specific information
- · Create an acronym, or a funny saying, or song to remember specific information
- · Draw a quick sketch to help with definitions or concepts
- · Practice math problems

**Type of Exams:** We have three types of exams at the end of each semester – EOC, CTE State Assessment, and Teacher-Made. Teachers will address which type of exam their students will take.

**Testing Window:** All exam testing must be completed between December 15 and December 21. This is true for ALL types of exams: EOC, CTE State Assessments, and Teacher-Made. Students may not test early, and if absent on an exam day, they must make arrangements to be at school on the make-up day in order to meet the approved testing window time-frame.

Score Results: All high school exams count 25% of a student's grade for the semester. Please emphasize this point to students so that they study.

**Exam review:** All teachers are expected to help students with review during class time and to distribute a review guide on canvas to students prior to testing. Teachers will have virtual review sessions for each class as stated in the schedule above. Students should begin organizing and reviewing material.

Academic Integrity: Please remind students of the need to prepare well for the exams and to make sure that they make ethical decisions when taking exams. The penalty for cheating of any kind is a "0" on a final exam.

Students will be required to turn in cell phones during testing sessions. If they do not want to do this, they should not bring their cell phone into the school.
