# Career Development Corner

11th Graders: Are you interested in applying for internships for Senior year? or an Advanced Manufacturing Pre-Apprenticeship?

#### **Internship Overview:**

Gives seniors an opportunity to get experience in a field of work they are interested in Seniors can do a flex internship which is a half credit and does not average into the student's GPA

Typically completed before/after school or summer

The full internship counts as a full class credit and averages into the student's GPA Student will either take internship course 1st or 4th block and must commit to at least 8 hours a week to be able to get all hours in

Refer to flyer on the next page for more detailed information.

### Advanced Manufacturing Pre-Apprenticeship Overview:

Student takes morning classes at High School while afternoon is split between classes at SPCC and working at Greiner Bio-One or other partner company

Student is paid for approximately 20 hours per week which is a combination of training, attending classes and work

Fall Classes at SPCC would begin in mid-August, 2021

Students receive High School Credit for their Community College Courses

Provides a potential opportunity to be selected for Registered Apprenticeship Program

Provides hands on training to develop technical skills

# **Internship Fact Sheet**

# Semester

The UCPS Career and Technical Education (CTE) Internship Program provides high school seniors opportunity for hands-on experience in areas of career or academic interest prior to college or post-secondary training. Internships may be paid or unpaid. Applications are ranked and processed based on program criteria.

#### QUALIFICATIONS CHECKLIST

- Senior during school year / rising senior for summer ☐ Has successfully completed two CTE courses within the same career cluster (Priority given to students who successfully completed a second-level CTE course and those who completed coursework in their internship area.)
- No more than 7 absences in any semester for the current and past two (2) years
- No suspensions (ISS or OSS) or serious disciplinary Incidents on high school record
- Reliable transportation
- Minimum 2.5 overall GPA
- Can attend at least 8 hours per week
- Positive feedback on references

#### APPLICATION PROCESS

- Apply online: <a href="https://ucpscte.org/work-based-learning/">https://ucpscte.org/work-based-learning/</a>
- · If you arrange your own intemship, fill in details and contact information on the application
- For medical internships, send or turn in vaccination
- Interview with prospective sponsor(s) if requested
- Flex applications accepted through April 30 for summer and through January 15 for the school year
- Semester applications accepted through October 1 (medical) or October 15 (non-medical) for second semester Internship and through May 1 for a first semester internship the following school year

#### REQUIRED ASSIGNMENTS

Most assignments are completed online

- Capstone Project

  - Workplace Readiness Modules

#### GRADE / CREDIT

Grade is based on required assignments, attendance at scheduled meetings and sponsor evaluation

#### Flex

- Grade entered directly into transcript after internship is completed
- Grade not factored in GPA calculation
- Elective credit: 68 hours = 1/4 unit 135 hours = 1 unit

- Grade shows on report card for each grading period
- Grade factored in GPA calculation
- Elective credit: 135 hours = 1 unit

#### SCHEDULING

Community sponsor and student determine schedule based on the business' hours of operation and their mutual convenience

- Minimum of 68 hours required (50 contact hours)
- Not bound by school calendar
- Completed any time school is not in session: after school, weekends, workdays, school breaks, summer

- Minimum of 135 hours required (100 contact hours)
- Placement must be confirmed before internship is added to class schedule
- Completed during first or second semester with one release period

#### BENEFITS to STUDENT

- Obtain a more realistic view of a career field and the world of work
- Connect classroom learning with career opportunities
- Make more informed decisions regarding postsecondary education or training
- Gain industry experience
- Make contacts that will help when applying for specific college programs or scholarships

# Second Semester Expectations for ALL Students Plan B and D and the Early Detection Program: CLICK HERE

Attendance will be taken for student participation on their assigned day at school and virtually each day in Power School. School is in session and students are expected to be in class or logged into a class session at the appropriate time each day unless otherwise stated. Students on Plan B will be counted absent if they are not in attendance on their assigned day.

Attendance and Absence Notes: Absence notes must be emailed and/or scanned to Mr. William Smith our data manager upon the student's return to school in order for the absence to be considered excused. Absences will be coded unexcused in PowerSchool until an email excuse is received. Please allow 24 hours for excusal notes to be coded in PowerSchool. Students may fail if they have 8 or more unexcused absences per class. Attendance is taken each class period. Students will have a chance to recover some unexcused absences.

**Friday Schedule:** Each student must check in with their teachers on Friday. Each teacher has been asked to communicate with students the expectations for each Friday. Attendance is taken on Friday, so students must complete assigned tasks for each teacher to be counted present. This information should be posted on each teacher Canvas page.

<u>Bus Info:</u> Parents should email <u>Ms. Tweed</u> if they need bus transportation. Bus riders and parents should sign up for the **Here Comes the Bus App.** This app allows you to view the real-time location of your child's school bus on your smartphone, tablet or computer. Be sure that your child is a their bus stop at least **20 minutes** before the scheduled arrival time. <u>Bus App Letter English</u> <u>Bus App Letter Spanish</u>

<u>Parking Passes</u>. One cannot drive and park at the school if they have not purchased a parking pass. Parking in any lot other than the student parking lot is not permitted. The process for purchasing parking pass is on FamilyID this year, an account will need to be created if you do not already have one. <u>Click here for FamilyID</u>. Parking passes MAY NOT be purchased by any student who has outstanding fees. After completion of the application, CATA will review your submission. The student will then receive a link to pay for the pass once the application has been approved via student UCPS email. Parking passes are \$45.
