UCPS Plan A and Plan D starting Monday, April 12

Dear CATA Family,

This is an important announcement about your student's Choice in Plans, beginning on Monday, April 12.

On March 15, the Union County Board of Education voted to move all schools to **Plan A**, with in-person instruction, five days a week, beginning Monday, April 12, that's the day we come back from spring break. **Please mark your calendars that Monday, April 12 is no longer a remote learning day. It's an in-person learning day for those choosing Plan A and a virtual learning day for those choosing Plan D.**

We need every family to complete and submit your option for Choice in Plans (Plan A or Plan D) by March 24, even if you are choosing to stay on the same plan, you will need to complete the form. This option is a fixed option and may not be changed again. This is essential for our planning purposes.

The following guidelines will be in place for Plan A in-person instruction:

- Students must always wear a mask (except while eating or taking a short, permitted mask break)
- Temperature checks and screenings will be done prior to entry to the building.
- Visitors are not permitted on campus without an appointment.
- In Plan A there will be minimal social distancing
- Contact tracing will continue with direct Blackboard communication to our school families to note that required quarantine could occur for an individual, group, or school.
