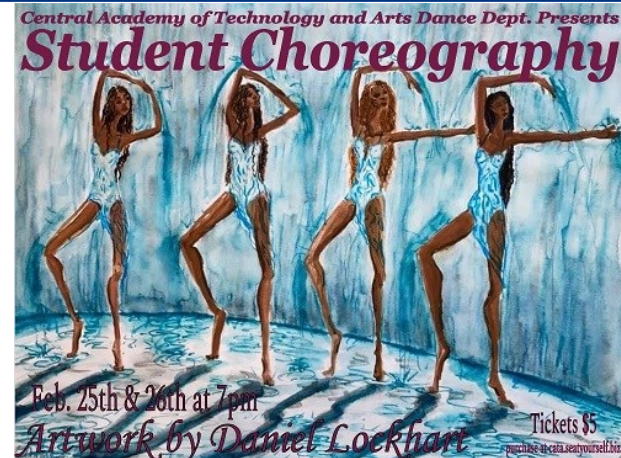

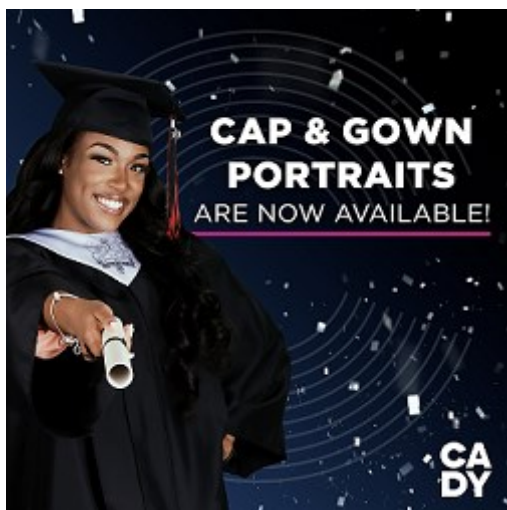

REGISTRATION

Classroom presentations (Feb. 14 - 25): Counselors will present to their academy classes about the registration process.

Registration Window (March 2 - 9): Students will be able to register in PowerSchool during this window.

2nd Block Counselor Meetings (March 14 - 31): Every student will meet with their counselor during 2nd block to review their registration. Each second block class is assigned a specific day for their meeting (swipe for schedule). Students who do not register within the window will meet with their counselor on the make-up days.

Make-Up Counselor Meetings (April 1st and 4th): These meetings will be for students who were absent on their assigned day or who did not register during the window.

Criminal Justice Professionals

- State and local sworn law-enforcement officers.
- State correctional officers.
- State juvenile justice officers.
- Other correctional officers maintained by local governments, and juvenile justice agencies.
- Sworn Sheriffs and Deputy Sheriffs.
- Detention Officers.
- Telecommunicators under the direct supervision of a law enforcement agency.



Fellowship

- Provide 100 fellowships annually for students to attend a NC community college that are interested in a criminal justice profession.
- The student must receive their Associates Degree.
- Students that receive the fellowship will have five years to repay the loan once receiving their Associates Degree.
- The loan will be forgiven if the student enters a criminal justice profession in an eligible county in North Carolina and works for four years.

Application Process

- The application process will open on November 1st and will close on May 31st of each year.
- The application can be located on the Department of Justice website www.ncdoj.gov.
- Applicants will be notified of their selection of a fellowship no later than June 1st of each year.



Every Applicant Must Submit:

- SAT/ ACT Scores.
- Transcript showing GPA.
- School and Community Service/ Activities.
- Essay describing your future career goals in the criminal justice profession.
- References.

After completion of their degree, the applicant must be employed as a criminal justice professional in an eligible county.

3

The applicant must not have been convicted of a felony or any crime as outlined in the course guide.

MISSION

The mission of the North Carolina Criminal Justice Fellows Program is to recruit talented high school graduates and high school seniors into the criminal justice profession. Each year this program will fund fellowships for scholars who have exhibited high academic achievement, a history of service to the school and community, and a desire to serve the state of North Carolina in a field within the criminal justice profession.

Additional Information

- We encourage applicants to begin establishing relationships with agencies they plan to seek employment with.
- This program is not meant for those who intend to get a Bachelor's Degree immediately after earning an Associates Degree.
- Those that are accepted into the program must graduate within two years with their Associates Degree.
- If a fellow chooses to work for a state agency he/she must request the agency post them in an eligible county.

INTERNSHIP

CATA

The UCPS Career and Technical Education (CTE) Internship Program provides high school seniors opportunity for hands-on experience in areas of career or academic interest prior to college or post-secondary training. Internships may be paid or unpaid. Applications are ranked and processed based on program criteria.

QUALIFICATIONS CHECKLIST

- ☐ Senior during school year / rising senior for summer
- ☐ Has successfully completed at least two CTE courses and reached concentrator status within a career pathway (Priority given to students completed coursework in their internship field.)
- ☐ No more than 7 absences in any semester for the current and past two (2) years
- ☐ No suspensions (ISS or OSS) or serious disciplinary incidents on high school record
- ☐ Reliable transportation
- ☐ Encourage at least 2.5 overall GPA
- ☐ Can attend at least eight hours per week
- ☐ Positive feedback on references

APPLICATION PROCESS

- Complete application in Major Clarity
- If you arrange your own internship, fill in details and contact information on the application
- For medical internships, submit vaccination records
- Interview with prospective sponsor(s), if necessary
- **Deadlines:** April 15 for a summer internship, May 1 for a first semester internship the following school year and October 1 (medical) or October 15 (non-medical) for a second semester internship.

GRADE / CREDIT

Grade is based on required assignments, attendance at scheduled meetings and sponsor evaluation. Successful completion of the course will result in one unit of general elective credit.

Semester

- Grade shows on report card for each grading period

Summer

- Grade added to transcript after completion of course requirements

SCHEDULING

Community sponsor and student determine schedule based on the business' hours of operation and their mutual convenience.

- Minimum of 135 total hours required (100 contact hours)
- Student attends at least eight hours per week (two or three days per week for three to four hours per day)

Semester

- Placement must be confirmed by Internship Coordinator before course is added to class schedule
- Completed during first or second semester with one release period

Summer

- Hours and assignments completed before the beginning of first semester

Thursday, February 17 - 19 3A Wrestling State Championships: Big Congratulations to our Wrestling Team who were the state runners up in the 3A State Tournament! CATA sent 6 wrestlers to the state competition and ALL 6 placed Top 6 in the state. We had 3 wrestlers win individual state championships: **Kyle Montaperto** is the State Champion for the 126 weight class. This is Kyle's 4th consecutive state championship!!! Attendance and Absence Notes: Absence notes must be emailed and/or scanned to [Mr. William Smith](#) our data manager upon the student's return to school in order for the absence to be considered excused. Absences will be coded unexcused in PowerSchool until an email excuse is received. Please allow 24 hours for excusal notes to be coded in PowerSchool. Students may fail if they have 8 or more unexcused absences per class. Attendance is taken each class period. Students will have a chance to recover up to three unexcused absences per class. Parents will receive notification upon the 3rd, 6th, and 8th unexcused absence.



Parking Passes— are now being sold on a first come first served basis. After we run out of spots, then students will be put on a waiting list. The process for purchasing parking passes will be on the online platform “**FamilyID**” An account has to be created if you do not already have one. Parking passes MAY NOT be purchased by any student who owes outstanding fees. After completion of the application, CATA will review your submission. The student will then receive a spot number and a link to pay for the pass once the application has been approved via the email provided in the registration form. Passes are \$45. 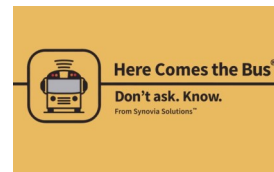

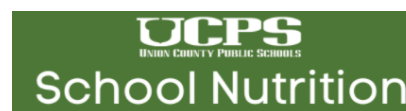


Bus Transportation:
