


DRESS FOR SUCCESS



A few dress code rules include:

- No headwear of any kind (sunglasses, hats, rags, hoods, or metal/plastic picks) may be worn on campus. They are only permissible at after school activities. Headbands used to actually hold hair back are permissible. Headwear normally worn overnight is not appropriate at school.
- Dresses and skirts must fall below the fingertips of the student with his/her hand by his/her side. Slits in skirts must also exceed fingertip length. Holes in clothing must be below fingertip as well. Running shorts should be loose-fitting and ALL shorts should be mid-hand length.
- No cut t-shirts, spaghetti straps, off-the-shoulder tops, mesh tops, tube tops, or halter tops are allowed. Sleeveless tops can be worn only if straps are the narrow width of a minimum of 3 fingers.
- No see-through clothing.
- No midriffs should show; shirts must be longer than the waistline of skirts, shorts, or pants. Pants and shorts are to be worn at the waist.
- No deep-plunging shirts; all shirts should adequately cover the upper body.
- Bedroom shoes, slippers or pajamas are not permitted.
- No neck bands or bracelets may be worn if they have metal spikes protruding from them.
- Wallet chains or any chains of considerable length on clothing are not to be worn as they present a safety hazard (considerable length is defined as more than 6" sag from point of contact to the clothing).
- Clothing and other items may not display, advertise, or promote any product or activity that is illegal or that is not permitted at school. Words or symbols that disrupt the school environment will not be permitted at school.
- Gang attire (including but not limited to clothing with sewn-in bandanas, etc.) and gang symbols are prohibited on campus at all times. Please refer to Union County Public School Policy on Prohibition of Gangs and Gang Activities located in your student handbook.







Sign Up For Tech Theatre II & Play Production

Tech II and Play Prudction allow technicians to apply what they learned in Tech I to a fully realized production. Tech students will work closely with a cast where they will run the backstage team. They will also learn advance design techniques including computer modeling, white modeling and scale perspective drawing.

Like theater but not performing. Tech Theatre I may be for you. Learn the basics of lighting, sound, costume, makeup and set design in construction using a hands on approach. Students will gain experience as the construct sets and provide technical support for productions



Sign Up for Theatre III/IV Honors

Theatre III/IV honors takes a deep dive into theatre and acting techniques. We explore how to apply Viewpoints, Method Acting and improvisational techniques into fully realized performances. We will also explore medieval and Greek theatre as well as audition techniques that can aid in preparing for college. Theatre III/IV students will gain performance experience as the participate in the NCTC play festival and the Theatre showcase.

Sign Up For Theatre II

Theatre II expands on the lessons learned in Theatre I. You will learn advanced acting techniques including but not limited to viewpoints, method acting and improvisational techniques. You will also be able to participate in two performance opportunities as you perform in this year's Theatre Showcase and a children's theater piece. Either theater I or instructor approval is required for this course.











Public Safety 1

"Public Safety 1 provides basic career information in public safety including corrections, emergency and fire management, security and protection, law enforcement, and legal services. Additionally, students will develop a personal plan for a career in public safety. The course includes skills in each area, using resources from the community to help deliver instruction to the students."

Law & Justice 1

"Students desiring to pursue a career in Law and Justice will examine the basic concepts of law related to citizens' rights and officers' responsibilities to maintain a safe society. This course begins with a study of various careers in public safety. The course will explore the history and development of law enforcement in the United States. Students will then examine the components of the criminal justice system, including the roles and responsibilities of the police, courts, and corrections."

Law & Justice 2

"This Honors course is an adapted course aligned with the nationally recognized Certified Protective Officer (CPO) certification through the International Federation of Protective Officers (IFPO). The legal age to obtain ones BLET certification is 21 years of age. NCDPI, in conjunction with a variety of Law Enforcement Agencies across NC, selected the CPO certification as a great opportunity for students to be employed in the field related to law enforcement at the age of 18. Students, who can begin their works experience in this field immediately out of high school can gain both a salary and experience, enabling them to pursue their post-secondary education while they wait to reach the legal age of 21 for entrance into a law enforcement career when desired"





STUDENT ABSENCES

- Students must turn in absence excuse notes to the Attendance Counselor **BEFORE** the start of the school day.
- Students are allowed FIVE school days after the end of an absence to bring a parent/ doctor note to document the reason for the absence. A parent note must be signed by a parent or guardian with a work and home telephone number for further clarification.
