We are excited for the start of school and we want to stress that the safety and security of our students and staff will remain our top priority. During the first two weeks of school PRHS Administrators, Teachers, and our School Resource Officer will meet with all students to discuss the safety measures in place at each of our schools. We will continue to stress the importance of students communicating to staff about any concerns and students being an active part of our school culture of respect. Our Student Support Team will be reminding our students of the ways that they can report any concerns (speaking with a PR Staff member, counselor or administrator, or using the Say Something app and/or UCPS Tip Line)

Our students will continue to meet twice weekly in advisory to work on leadership and life skills. Our students will be with the same advisor throughout their high school years and it is a great opportunity for mentorship.

We do ask all parents to update contact information so that we can contact you easily for regular school information and should any needs arise with your child. We ask parents to make sure that they complete the medical information forms each year as well so that we can meet your child's needs. - 1. School day hours: 8:10-3:05 (Class starts at 8:10, students should all arrive by 8:00 to move to class.)
- 2. If you are dropping your student off;, you should arrive between 7:45—7:55 to ensure that your child can get to class on time.
- 3. Lunches are determined by the 3rd block teacher. We will inform students of their lunch time on the first day of school.
- 4. Upon arrival on the first day of school, all students will report to first period. Students can look up their schedules using their MyEdCloud access. Staff will be onsite to assist.
- 5. Set uniforms are not required for PE classes, but a dress code is strictly enforced. This will be discussed during the first day of class. Sneakers, athletic shorts, and t-shirt are required every day.
- 6. Lockers are not required, but you may rent a locker for \$5.00.
- 7. Students can find supply lists for their classes on the syllabus for the class, however, supply lists may not be definite until the first day of school. To access the syllabus, go to the PRHS website, click on the 'I want to' button in the right hand side, click on staff directory, and find your teacher's name. There is a link to the classroom canvas page in this part of the directory. Please know that the syllabus for the course will be available starting 8/26. Supply Lists will also be reviewed by teachers on the first day of class. Students should bring their chromebook charged to school with them the first day, along with paper and pen/pencil.
- 8. Attendance is taken during each class, and it is vital that you are present at school every day for every class. Attendance matters for participation in extracurricular activities, credit for courses, and affects eligibility for sports. Students too sick to come to school may not be on school grounds for extracurricular events that day. Absence notes MUST be turned in to the front office or emailed within five days of an absence to Ms. Andrea Ortega, our attendance counselor.
- 9. Every teacher will have a web page (on Canvas) for students and parents to access with course information.
- 10. All students will receive a student login/password to the Parent Portal so that they can see their grades. This will become active Tuesday, September 6.
- 11. Students are expected to check their school email account daily as both teachers and administration use this to communicate with students.
- 12. Please take the time to read or browse the Pirate Press each week. All important school information is in the newsletter.

We PRide ourselves in a safe campus with adequate supervision. To that end, due to Staff Hours and School Start and End Times: Students should not arrive on campus prior to 7:45 am each day. 


Parking Permits

Parking Passes sales for the 2022-23 school year will open on Friday, August 5 and are \$40. Students must fill out the online application by <u>CLICKING HERE</u> and students may pay by <u>CLICKING HERE</u>. (Please note that all of the links needed are in the online application as well.)

- 1. Students must be logged into the UCPS student google account in order to access the online application.
- 2. Students must upload a picture of their valid drivers license in the application.
- 3. Students must upload a proof of payment from the PRHS OSP online payment system in the application.
- 4. Students and parents will digitally sign by typing their names in the application.
- 5. Once an application is approved students will receive an email in their UCPS accounts with a parking spot number the week before school starts.
- 6. Students are to use this email (Screenshot or print out) to park in the appropriate spot on the first day of school. Passes will be handed out at lunch.






New to PRHS Administrators

Please remember that schedules are tentative and can change based on staffing, changes in courses offered, or other school-based reasons. NOTE: Students can access schedules through their Student PowerSchool account. Parents will not have access to see schedules on Parent Portal until 10 days into the semester. Parents should ask students to pull schedule up through their my.ncedcloud.org account.

Schedule Corrections:

The Schedule Correction Google Form opened <u>Monday, August 22nd</u>. Counselors will work on "Please See Counselor" holes first. "Please See Counselor" is listed on your schedule if your counselor was not able to fill your schedule with courses you selected, including alternates. Please make sure that you check your schedule in PowerSchool and fill out the Schedule Correction Google Form if needed.

The Schedule Correction Google Form will close on Friday, September 2nd at 5:00 pm.

--Requests for 1st & 2nd semester should be made at this time. All corrections must be requested on the same submission. Only one request will be allowed.

--All schedules have been reviewed. We will not make changes for students who were placed in the 1st or alternative courses requested.

Requests will only be considered for the following:

- * senior is missing a required class for graduation or for college admissions
- * student has not met or is missing a prerequisite for a course for which they are enrolled
- * student is taking a course that he/she has passed
- * student is missing a required core course (English, Math, Science, Social Studies) in their schedule
- * student has the same course listed twice on the schedule
- *student has "Please See your counselor" listed on their schedule

Please See Counselor is listed on your schedule if your counselor was not able to fill your schedule with courses you selected (including alternates). Please make sure to fill out the form, so that your schedule is ready for the 1st day of school, which is Monday, August 29th.

A counselor will email you as we are able to process your request at your UCPS school email whether a correction car or cannot be made to your schedule.

I'm Ms. Schaeffer, the college advisor, and I'll be at Porter Ridge on Mondays, Tuesdays, and alternating Fridays. College and scholarship applications are right around the corner, so we're jumping right into the process.

Please make sure all of the schools you intend to apply to are under the "Applying" column on your Scoir account so your counselors and I can send all of your supplemental documents in a timely manner. If you're not sure how to do that, good news! UCPS College Readiness is hosting an event called "Scoir for Senior Parents (And Seniors!)" on August 30th at 6:00pm. It will be a webinar, and you can register <u>at this link</u>.

Make sure to request teacher recommendations ASAP. Teachers are busy people, and the further in advance you ask, the better they can make their letter. **You should ask no later than 2 weeks before your application is due, and you should ask in person—it's polite!**

You can find upcoming College Visits in Scoir. Ms. Green and I will be advertising each visit closer to when it is scheduled, but you can sign up at any time. I'll be sending an email about the scholarship nomination process process in the coming days, so if you'd like to be considered for scholarships such as Belk, Morehead-Cain, and Levine, keep an eye out for that!



Cell Phone Expectations

→ Cell phones (headphones) may be used in a respectful manner during class transitions in between class periods and during lunches.

- → Cell phones must be silenced and put away during class periods. Away means stored in a backpack, or in a teacher-designated location.
- → Teachers do have discretion to allow students to use their cell phone for an instructional purpose during class time.
- → If you violate this you will lose the privilege to have your phone (and headphones) during class.

Students today have more opportunity to use their cell phone in school. School staff understand the importance of having a cell phone and respect that, however, we also must maintain a focus on learning for each and every student. To that end, we have a cell phone policy that supports our Culture of Respect here at PRHS, and that aids our students in showing leadership readiness skills. Attendance Policy

STUDENT ABSENCES

- Students must turn in absence excuse notes to the Attendance Counselor **BEFORE** the start of the school day.
- Students are allowed FIVE school days after the end of an absence to bring a parent/ doctor note to document the reason for the absence. A parent note must be signed by a parent or guardian with a work and home telephone number for further clarification. An absence will be recorded as unexcused until the parent/ doctor note is submitted.
- After FIVE days the absence is recorded as unexcused/unlawful. Doctor/Medical notes may be considered after this in special cases. Parent notes will not be accepted after five days.
- All parent notes are subject to review and may result in a required parent-administration meeting in order to be considered.

CLASS ATTENDANCE

Attendance will be taken each period by the teacher and submitted to the office via PowerSchool; a part of each student's permanent record. A student must be in class for a minimum of 75 minutes to be counted present for that class period. A few exceptions to this policy include: attending school sponsored events, a late bus and/ or a conference with administration. Credit will not be granted for classes when absences for a student reach 8 days unless a waiver is granted. (Please know that these are not granted frequently.)

Credit will not be granted for classes when absences for a student reach eight days for a semester long course or an A day or B day course. Absences include those that are lawful, unlawful, and due to suspension. When students accumulate eight or more absences and documentation is on file at the school which indicates circumstances beyond the control of the student and parents contributed to the accumulation of eight or more absences, an appeal may be made to the principal to waive absences and allow the student to pass. An appeal of the principal's decision may be made to the Superintendent.

The students will have the opportunity to recover a small number of absences that were beyond their control. Students and parents are asked to make consistent school attendance a priority.



Tardy Policy

TARDY POLICY

Student Tardies will reset every semester giving all students a fresh start. Students are expected to be in class when the tardy bell rings. Tardies will be addressed in the following manner:

- Attendance is counted every single class period
- Tardy means being up to 15 minutes late to class
- An excused absence is still an absence
- Absent means missing 16 or more minutes from the beginning, middle or end of any class

All students must report to Mr. Bundick when tardy to obtain a Late Pass to class.

- 1st Tardy Warning / No Consequence
- 2nd Tardy Warning / Parent Contact
- 3rd Tardy One (1) day of Lunch Detention and Parent Contact
- 4th Tardy Two (2) day of Lunch Detention and Parent Contact
- 5th Tardy One (1) day of After School Detention (ASD) and Parent Contact
- 6th Tardy Two (2) day of After School Detention (ASD) and Parent Contact
- 7th Tardy One (1) day of Saturday Academy and Parent Contact (Loss of parking permit for 1 week)
- 8th Tardy Parent Conference with administration
- 9th Tardy One (1) day of Saturday Academy and Parent Contact
- 10th Tardy permanent loss of parking permit. Further disciplinary action for non-drivers



Dress Code

We do have a dress code at PRHS. **Dressing for school should be different than dressing for other events.** A few dress code rules include:

- No headwear of any kind (sunglasses, hats, rags, hoods, or metal/plastic picks) may be worn on campus. They are only permissible at after school activities. Headbands used to actually hold hair back are permissible. Headwear normally worn overnight is not appropriate at school.
- Dresses and skirts must fall below the fingertips of the student with his/her hand by his/her side. Slits in skirts must also exceed fingertip length. Holes in clothing must be below fingertip as well. Running shorts should be loose-fitting and ALL shorts should be mid-hand length.
- No cut t-shirts, spaghetti straps, off-the-shoulder tops, mesh tops, tube tops, or halter tops are allowed. Sleeveless tops can be worn only if straps are the narrow width of a minimum of 3 fingers.
- No see-through clothing.
- No midriffs should show; shirts must be longer than the waistline of skirts, shorts, or pants. Pants and shorts are to be worn at the waist.
- No deep-plunging shirts; all shirts should adequately cover the upper body.
- Bedroom shoes, slippers, headwear, or pajamas are not permitted.
- No neck bands or bracelets may be worn if they have metal spikes protruding from them.
- Wallet chains or any chains of considerable length on clothing are not to be worn as they present a safety hazard (considerable length is defined as more than 6" sag from point of contact to the clothing).
- Clothing and other items may not display, advertise, or promote any product or activity that is illegal or that is not permitted at school. Words or symbols that disrupt the school environment will not be permitted at school.
- Gang attire (including but not limited to clothing with sewn-in bandanas, etc.) and gang symbols are prohibited on campus at all times. Please refer to Union County Public School Policy on Prohibition of Gangs and Gang Activities located in your student handbook.

The faculty and administration reserve the right to question and discourage ANY attire that's disruptive to the educational process. The Dress Code will evolve to meet the changing needs of teen fashion interests.

Consequences: The goal of the dress code consequences is to return students to class as quickly as possible. Students that are not dressed in alignment with the dress code will be asked to get in dress code. If a student cannot do so, parents will be called and asked to bring alternate clothing.
