

Porter Ridge Schedule: Mondays, Tuesdays, and alternating Fridays

- Put all of the schools you intend to apply to are under the "Applying" column on your Scoir account
- Request teacher recommendations ASAP. You should ask no later than 2 weeks before your application is due, and you should ask in person—it's polite! Learn how to make the requests on Scoir HERE.
- Sign up for upcoming College Visits in Scoir <u>CLICK HERE</u> for instructions
- When you're filling out the Common Application, please ONLY put counselor and teacher names, NOT email addresses. Because we use Scoir, when you add email addresses, the process of colleges identifying supplemental documents gets held up, and that can mean you don't hear back as quickly about your application. If you've already added your counselor and/or teacher and their email addresses in Common App, you need to go edit it and take out the email address ASAP.



The UCPS Career and Technical Education (CTE) Internship Program provides high school seniors opportunity for hands-on experience in areas of career or academic interest prior to college or post-secondary training. Internships may be paid or unpaid. Applications are ranked and processed based on program criteria.

QUALIFICATIONS CHECKLIST

- ☐ Senior during school year / rising senior for summer ☐ Has successfully completed at least two CTE
- courses and reached concentrator status within a career pathway (Priority given to students completed coursework in their internship field.)
- ☐ No more than 7 absences in any semester for the current and past two (2) years
- ☐ No suspensions (ISS or OSS) or serious disciplinary incidents on high school record
- Reliable transportation
- ☐ Encourage at least 2.5 overall GPA
- ☐ Can attend at least eight hours per week
- ☐ Positive feedback on references

APPLICATION PROCESS

- · Complete application in Major Clarity
- · If you arrange your own internship, fill in details and contact information on the application
- · For medical internships, submit vaccination records
- · Interview with prospective sponsor(s), if necessary
- . Deadlines: April 15 for a summer internship, May 1 for a first semester internship the following school year and October 1 (medical) or October 15 (non-medical) for a second semester internship.

REQUIRED ASSIGNMENTS

SCHEDULING

Community sponsor and student determine schedule based on the business' hours of operation and their mutual convenience.

- Placement must be confirmed by Internship Coordinator before course is added to class schedule
- Completed during first or second semester with one release period

Summer

· Hours and assignments completed before the beginning of first semester




MAJOR CLARITY



"Major Clarity"

UCPS continues to utilize a program called Major Clarity for career resources. All Porter Ridge High School students have a Major Clarity account and they can access it by going to the UCPS High School Student Start Up page and click on their NCEdCloud IAM Clever title to login in. Students will then click on the Clever tile. Click on Student & Teacher Log in with NCEDCloud and scroll down until they see More apps and select the Major Clarity tile. Once they are in their Major Clarity account, on the left hand side they can select assessments and take the Personality Assessment & Learning Styles Assessment. After the student takes the Personality Assessment, back on the left side they can click Career Exploration and either search for what they would like to see or if they scroll down, they will see careers that have a Fit Score and click on them to learn more about each career. Below are screenshots as well. Another resource in Major Clarity students can earn Micro-Credentials. Micro-Credentials can be received after students complete a mini course. These credentials can help students take the next step in their career discovery and help them stand-out by earning subject matter micro-credentials, built in partnership with leading employers and educational institutions. ACADEMIC STANDARDS

All Stakeholder Survey for K-12 Arts, K-12 Guidance, and K-12 World Language Standards

In August, the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction (NCDPI) Office of Academic Standards' team kicked off the review phase for K-12 Arts, K-12 Guidance, and K-12 World Language Standards. This cohort of standards will follow the NC Standard Course of Study Manual in terms of process and timeline.

Per the Internal Procedures Manual, the review phase consists of data collection and analysis, as well as research. The NCDPI team is seeking input on the current K-12 Arts, K-12 Guidance, and K-12 World Language standards from educators, administrators, parents, students, institutions of higher education, business/industry representatives, national organizations, and other education agencies.

These surveys are being shared to gather thoughtful input and comments from stakeholders familiar with the Arts, Guidance, and/or World Language Standard Course of Study in order to inform revision decisions, which may include changes, clarifications, additions, deletions, or replacements to the current standards.

Any individual who wishes to provide input on the Standard Course of Study may complete this survey. This survey is estimated to take about 10 to 20 minutes to complete, depending on how many grades or courses you choose to review.

We thank you for your time and input. Your feedback is extremely valuable to the standards review and revision process.

STUDENT ABSENCES

- Students must turn in absence excuse notes to the Attendance Counselor BEFORE the start of the school day.
- Students are allowed **FIVE school** days after the end of an absence to bring a parent/ doctor note to document the reason for the absence. A parent note must be signed by a parent or guardian with a work and home telephone number for further clarification. An absence will be recorded as unexcused until the parent/ doctor note is submitted.
- After FIVE days the absence is recorded as unexcused/unlawful.
 Doctor/Medical notes may be considered after this in special cases.
 Parent notes will not be accepted after five days.
- All parent notes are subject to review and may result in a required parent-administration meeting in order to be considered.
