** Students will be dismissed after the exam period ends (approximately 12:10). Bus transportation will leave @12:30.







Attention Graduating High School Seniors! Need a job? How about a career instead! We will teach you and pay you!

McCall Brothers is looking for motivated applicants interested in participating in a paid two year groundwater development training program leading to permanent employment with the company. Successful applicants will be trained in various elements of the groundwater construction industry including drill rig operation and well construction, well pump service and installation, water filtration equipment installation and service, construction dewatering services, etc. The two-year program is designed to bring the trainee from virtually no knowledge of the industry to successfully becoming a licensed well contractor in North Carolina and South Carolina.

Trainees will begin on the ground floor and receive classroom and actual field training in proper well construction and groundwater pumping systems. This will include instruction and training to operate various forms of drilling equipment, overhead cranes and hoists, as well as training in servicing and installing all types of water pumping equipment and water filtration equipment. Proper record keeping and job data entry on computer tablets, along with appropriate regulatory paperwork filing will also be taught. Along the way, trainees will receive health and safety training and test for various licenses they will need.

Successful applicants will receive performance reviews every six months and be evaluated for pay increases based on their progress. Starting pay is \$13.50 per hour with current premium pay of \$28.00 per hour available upon completion of the two-year program and successful completion of all specified milestones. Standard work week is 50 hours typically (overtime pay after 40 hours). Out of town work includes meals and hotel allowances. Weekend and after-hours on-call services are compensated and include sales percentage incentives. Typical employee pay ranges from \$45,000 to \$60,000 per year.

Successful applicants must be at least 18 years of age, have a high school diploma and valid NC Driver's License. Basic math skills and good reading and writing skills are essential. McCall Brothers is a drug free workplace so selected trainees will receive pre-employment drug screens. McCall Brothers is actively taking applications now but will work with successful applicants to coordinate interviews and allow them to begin work after graduation. McCall Brothers intends to select six (6) to eight (8) new employees from the application pool to participate in the new training program.


