## **Site Based Meeting Minutes**

May 11, 2010 6:30pm Media Center

#### PRHS Student Services

- Rebecca Manning reported that registration has been completed for the 2010-2011 school year. They will be working with the students who are returning to PRHS from Piedmont High School to get them scheduled. In addition, the guidance staff has begun planning for new student registration (since we did not have to do this last year!).
- Sam Basden also said that senior failure notifications are in the process of being prepared since we have now completed the first two grading periods of the semester.

#### PRHS Instruction

- o Report Cards for the 5<sup>th</sup> six weeks grading period went out last week.
- Sam Basden also informed the committee that a number of senior events are coming up including senior week, cap and gown picture day, and the senior assembly.

### PRHS Operations

o Budget Report – Mr. Basden reported that the budget picture is grim for next year. He reported that we have the potential for about 100 additional students next year because of the grandfather clause of the reassignment plan. He currently is projecting about 1550 students for the opening of school. In addition, he projects that our ADM (average daily membership) allotment of teachers will decrease and we will have few teachers next year. He does not know what criteria will be used to determine which teachers will no longer be at PRHS next year and whether or not our losses will be confined to retirements and resignations. Current county projections show that Union County will likely lose about 200 positions. In terms of how this will impact classes, Mr. Basden says that classes with fewer than 18 students are not likely to be offered. In addition, some electives with full loads (more than 18 students) may not be offered because the number of teachers we have will be needed to offer core courses.

## Site Base/CLT

School Improvement Plan – April Dawkins reported that she has asked the correlate chairs to discuss revision of the SIP goals and objectives at their May meetings.

Mission/Vision Statement – The full faculty voted to approve the proposed mission and statement at its April meeting. Steve Jackson made a motion to accept the mission and vision statement as recommended by the faculty. Libby Meiners seconded the motion. The motion carried. The mission and

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vision statement will now be added to our school's website and included in our new School Improvement Plan.

## New Business

April Dawkins reported that she had spoken with Mr. Bill Rogers, Athletic Director, about the proposed Meet the Coaches event for 8<sup>th</sup> graders. He has said that he will review the calendar and see if it is possible to work out a date to do this.
