Key Points

- Answer the Prompt
- Keep it Simple
- All about you
- Specific, detailed and vivid
- Write how you speak
- Have it proofread and corrected by no more than 2 people

Make it Personal

- Tell a story
- The essay is a way for the reader to understand why you do what you do
 - Reader needs to see what you are seeing
 - Reader needs to feel what you are feeling
 - Explain significance of event and what does it show about you
 Hone in on one experience a lens through which they see how you and how your world operates
- Not more or a repeat of your resume do not talk about what you do
- Less on academics but more on personal in essay. Want to get to know you not an academic essay.

Brainstorming

How to Find the story - 3 ways to Brainstorm

- 1. Find your Strengths not your talent but your underlying qualities
 - a. Examples
 - i. Great in seeing things make connections
 - ii. Solve complex issues
 - iii. Observant
 - b. This free personality test

(http://www.humanmetrics.com/cgi-win/jtypes2.asp#questionnaire) is based on Carl Jung's and Isabel Briggs Myers' personality type theory. Knowing your personality types can help in understanding your underlying strengths.

Brainstorming

- c. Use strengths to identify when showed up in lifei. Examples Strong willed, Charismatic
- d. Find different experiences when this strength showed let strengths show in telling the story but not by using the words but in the telling of the story. Let the reader draw the conclusions.

Brainstorming

- 2. Ask 6 to 8 people who know you well from different parts of your life:
 - What 3 Adjectives best describe me?
 - Write exactly what tell you
 - Map out findings
 - Need to show development of where you are and want to become
- 3. Free write in a journal
 - Socialize and share the story to see how others see it.

Tips

Tone

- Start fast readers are reading a lot
- Meat in middle that matters focus on story
- Match vocabulary to kind of person you are, make sure it sounds like you,
 conversational and relaxed language
- Be specific, vivid and detailed
- Nitty gritty details not surface level

Tips

- Depth & Substance
 - Read something that has changed in you
 - Doing things not enough need to give a story
 - Not just facts
 - Need a reveal moment on the change of thinking
 - Use the story to reveal. If have to explicitly say it have created distance with reader

Tips

- Ask yourself these questions
 - What does this mean to me
 - How has this experience changed me or not changed me
 - How do I act or feel, think or feel differently because of it
- What do I want admissions officer to learn about me and how applicable to me at the campus

Summary

- Choose topic that will showcase you
- Keep it simple
- Begin with a hook to encourage reader to find out more
- Focus on learning and development as a person
- Tell your story and how it impacted you
- Use your own words
- Do not state what you learned it should show in your story
- Have it proofread by no more than 2 people
