Teachers come prepared to PLC meetings with data entered into Data Trackers in order to discuss trends and best practices. Teachers collect informal and formal data to speak on their students' strengths and weaknesses. Instructional Support Staff run reports of school-wide achievement to analyze the trends across the grade levels. Evidence of success includes students completing assessments and teachers fully utilizing data trackers. During PLC meetings teachers are engaged in data conversations.
