3:15 - 3:20	Welcome - Introduction of Mr. Bohlen to the team as a parent representative Attendance: Harvey, Malone, Goodson, Stine, Pipkins, Monro, Gooden, Swartz, Flannery, Russell, Berton, Dion, Isa Ocejo and Darius Cleare	
3:20 - 3:25	Discipline/Tardies - interventions in place to help with behaviors: cell phone violations top; unauthorized area and cutting class the second and third. The difference between cutting class and being in an unauthorized area is due to the amount of time a student is out of class. May need some clarity between these two referrals. CTE has the most referrals due to # of classes-38 referrals.	
	Tardies during 1st block has increased significantly; averaging 50+; most tardies are happening due to students arriving to school late. Malone has pulled a list of student drivers who are late-4 on the list; 2 had their parking permits revoked on 10/29. Parent drop off is the issue. Discussed traffic issues-brought to the attention of the group by Mr. Bolton; he indicates it has gotten worse in the past week when coming from Stallings.	
	Motion by Harvey, Seconded by Monro: Students who are tardy when returning from lunch are in an unauthorized area, first offense: afterschool detention; 2 offense an in-school suspension; 3 offense an out of school suspension.

STRIVE - ACT Prep, Math Intervention

NC Check-in Data: English took one and prepped to take second; Math 1 and Math 3 has taken first check-in; Biology took their first today.

Harvey met with juniors last Friday and reviewed their pre-ACT data; felt it was well received and how they can improve by improving the grammar that we review in STRIVE.

Beighle-WorkKeys: he has spoken to all students who will take WorkKeys and invited them to join Albert IO for review. Identified students we can help improve their scores.

Graduation rate: we have received the data of students who should graduated. Last year we graduated 93%, our goal is to improve upon this. Significant # of Early Grads-this year we have 27 mid-years and 7 22 credit students.

Growth data: met growth overall as a school; no specific group exceeded growth expectations. AA students are underperforming; Malone is heading a group to look at how we can improve with this group. Meeting with students individually and having conversations about learning preferences and barriers to success. Will share the results of these conversations with staff once they have completed their conversations. 110 AA students enrolled in EOC courses this semester.

We have added IXL to science, math, and English to improve results in these areas and offer support. EOC classes and 11th graders are given priority.

Proposal to STRIVE changes: Universal Intervention
-8th grade proficiency was 9% Math EOG at the middle school with this incoming 9th grade class



	Idea is to have some accountability teams who would meet with 9th grade students instead of them attending 1st-HR STRIVE; there would be accountability teams for each area that needs improvement. English 2, Math 1 and 3, Biology, WORKKEYS, graduation, etc.

A CTE teacher with over 20k copies; math teacher with 16ksome teachers aren't using much paper at all. Ordered 50 more cases of paper and half has been distributed to teachers.
